


Become an Olympic athlete. Record your stats for Olympic officials. Measure each body part using metric units of length. Color your athlete to represent your favorite country.



Teacher's Guide

Description: Metric Me is a measurement activity where students measure their body parts in metric units and record the measurements.

Skills: The students will measure lengths in standard units of meters and centimeters.

Grade levels: 2-5

Background information: Before completing the activity, students need to have a basic knowledge of metric units of length. This activity is designed as a review activity for students who already have a basic understanding of metric measurement.

Materials: Metric Me worksheet

Meter sticks

pencils

Procedure:

- Introduce the activity to students by explaining that they have all just qualified as athletes in the 2012 Olympics. Tell them they now need to report their "stats" to the Olympic committee.
- Read over the worksheet and make sure students understand what they should measure on the worksheet. Demonstrate as necessary.
- 3. Allow students to work on measuring body parts and recording.
- 4. Assess the students by checking for reasonable answers. Answers will vary.

Extending the activity:
